This is my Blessing Story. It's an excerpt from my book.

"I just have to know. You're a teacher; your husband is a minister. Why don't you have children?" asked the allergist on my first and last visit to her office.

Dealing with my childlessness had been a ten-year search for healing and connections with other women. Journalizing, writing poetry, reading, and prayer were my best resources. I had read more than twenty nonfiction books about childlessness. However, I remember my first response when I found a poem by a childless woman. I could not take my eyes off the words until I had memorized at least two verses. Reading poetry about this experience was powerful for me. I bought handmade paper and copied this poem by hand.

I searched for poems by childless women whose voice would connect to my experience. I believe God answered my prayers for healing and strength by offering me the opportunity to publish a book. *I Will Bear This Scar: Poems of Childless Women* includes the work of more than forty women. Eight years after publication it continues to sell copies almost every month. This book has been a blessing for me and I pray it's been a blessing for other women.

Alternative Christmas Gift Opportunity

What gifts will you be giving or receiving this Christmas? A sweater? A new electronic gadget? Toys? Video games?

Have you considered giving the gift of life?

This year, UPC is offering the opportunity for our church to participate in purchasing life-saving water filtration systems for children in Kenya. Each year more than 3 million people world-wide die from water borne diseases, and the vast majority of those are young children. But with the use of very simple water filtration systems, lives can be saved and health improved.

The water filtration systems that UPC is helping to purchase will benefit the Crossroads Springs Institute in Hamisi, Kenya, a primary school which educates children orphaned by AIDS. Our goal of \$2000 will enable the school to acquire an institutional filter for the kitchen as well as many "point-of-use" filters for each classroom and other parts of the school. Each point-of-use filter costs around \$50.

Please consider being part of this important gift-giving opportunity where you can know that your money will make a crucial difference to a child's life. You can make your donation each week during Advent, either by using the special envelopes in the pew racks or after worship at a table in the Holzwarth Room where you can also pick up a beautiful gift card to give to the person you are honoring.
