## Congratulations, UPC!!

University Presbyterian Church learned that we have received one of the Lilly Endowment's Clergy Renewal grants. These are very competitive grants, which enable congregations to offer their pastors a sabbatical time for renewal and restoration. Let me share with you some of what the Endowment writes about this special grant:

"University Presbyterian Church has received a grant of \$49,990 to enable its minister, Tracy Daub, to participate in the 2010 National Clergy Renewal Program funded by the Indianapolis-based Lilly Endowment Inc. It is one of 150 congregations across the country that will support their ministers in the program, which allows pastors to step back from their busy lives and renew their spirits for the benefit of their ongoing ministries.

"Now in its 11<sup>th</sup> year, the program invites Christian congregations and ministers to consider and plan a period of intentional reflection and renewal. It provides a time for ministers to take a break from their daily obligations and gain the fresh perspective and renewed energy that a carefully considered 'sabbath time' of travel, study, rest and prayer can provide.

"Each congregation is eligible to apply for a grant of up to \$50,000. Up to \$15,000 of that amount can be used to fulfill pastoral duties during the minister's absence and for expenses related to the congregation's own renewal. The 150 grants this year total \$6.4 million."

Craig Dykstra, senior vice president for religion at the Endowment states, "We ask these congregations and ministers to consider the question, 'What will make your heart sing?', as they devise their plans. They never fail to come up with wonderful and imaginative yet doable ways to fulfill their dreams. Their time away has freed them up to pursue personal interests and needs in ways that have given them new energy for ministry—and congregations have discovered that they too experience a refreshment of their own and a newfound sense of their own strengths."

The Endowment's larger goal is "to bolster the good work that America's pastors and congregations accomplish day in and day out and to reinforce and build upon important work being done on both sides of the pulpit." Dykstra adds, "we hope to strengthen the efforts of today's excellent pastors because it is no secret that pastors who have reconnected themselves to the passions that led them to the ministry in the first place are more likely to lead healthy and vibrant congregations."

The journey toward this grant took form about two years ago when I began to consider the idea and to deliberate upon the Endowment's question: "What will make your heart sing?" A year ago, the Session voted for our congregation to apply for one of these grants and it formed a "Sabbatical Planning Team" consisting of 6 Session members with the mission of writing the grant to offer renewal opportunities for both the clergy and the congregation. A copy of the completed grant is available in the Holzwarth Room for UPC members to read but let me highlight some of its components.

The theme of UPC's Renewal Program centers on the scriptural phrase "Treasures in Earthen Vessels." Protestants are people whose faith is rooted primarily in ideas and words and we are often unsettled by the idea that God dwells in the material world of our bodies and nature. Our worship services are typically passive experiences with an emphasis on hearing the Word as it is contained in the pages of the Bible. Yet, this is a very narrow and incomplete perspective on God's presence. After 17 years of ordained ministry where I have Sunday after Sunday endeavored to probe the pages of the Bible in search of God's word for us, I am eager to spend some concentrated time "reading" other texts in which the treasure of God's presence can also be found. There are three areas in which my Renewal Program will focus on discovering this presence of God in the material world around and within us.

First, I am drawn to God's presence in nature, specifically in the life and behavior of wild animals. Occasions when I have been able to observe or learn about wildlife have always "made my heart sing" and have convinced me that this beautiful and complex created order is also God's word made flesh. For one month of the Renewal Program, my family and I will travel to Australia where we will assist in monitoring threatened species in the South Australian outback at a wildlife re-introduction program, visit other locations around Australia which offer astounding varieties of wildlife and ecosystems, and visit Aboriginal cultural and spiritual sites in order to learn more about the Aboriginal understanding of the Creator's presence in the material world.

Second, the Renewal Program will enable me to develop my emerging skills as a potter. I will spend more time at the local pottery studio where I am currently a member and will also travel to Ghost Ranch, the Presbyterian conference center in New Mexico, where I will take a pottery course. As I participate in the creative process of shaping the cold, wet clay into a vessel, I cannot help but think that my efforts, however imperfect, emulate God's own creative energies.

Finally, the Renewal Program offers an occasion to take better care of my own "vessel"—my body. Both family and congregational responsibilities have adversely affected my discipline of regular exercise. By hiking trails here in Western New York as well as hiking opportunities during my travels, and by creating an exercise program at a gym, I hope to take care of the earthen vessel of my body where God resides.

UPC's grant also includes renewal opportunities for the congregation, which correspond to the themes I will be exploring. During my absence, UPC will offer four monthly events which will include guided hikes along the Niagara River, an artist-in-residence program with hands-on opportunities for creating a variety of art, and an evening of fun and fitness with line-dancing and Wii-Fit activities. Three neighboring Presbyterian congregations will be invited to join in these activities with us. After my return from the sabbatical, the congregation and I will have an opportunity to join in a weekend retreat where we will share some of our insights during this period. Details about all these events will follow in the months to come.

The Renewal Program will take place from June through September of 2011. The Session is in the process of seeking a highly qualified ordained pastor to offer pastoral coverage and worship leadership during my absence. While we are working out the details of this sabbatical time, we encourage you to please share any questions or concerns you may have about the Renewal Program with me or any member of the Session.

A prayer I recently read invited us to remember that the good things of our lives are gifts from God rather than rewards we have earned. This grant is a tremendous gift for all of us at UPC. May our hearts be filled to overflowing with gratitude for this blessing.

Anyone interested in volunteering one afternoon a month at the Pantry can call Gerry Grisante at 835-0433.

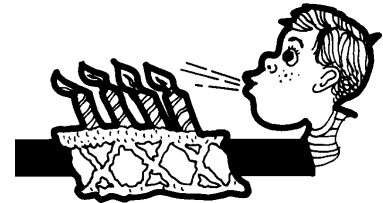
