

Christian Education Opportunities This Fall

Children's Class:

Children (ages 5 years through 7th grade) will meet in a multi-aged class, taught by a team of rotating teachers. Class time will start with music, offered by Tiffany Whitefield, collective time as an entire group, followed by smaller groups for age-based activities.

Teachers this fall will be: Marge Waldron (Sept. 16-Oct. 7), Amy Erikson (Oct. 14-Nov. 18), and Ginna Coon (Dec. 2-23). Jude Hammer and Sandy Robertson will alternate as classroom aides.

Adult Class:

The remaining Sundays in the fall semester will be taught by Dr. Timothy Wadkins, Professor of Religious Studies at Canisius College. Dr. Wadkins, always a popular and engaging teacher, will lead us in a discussion of the following topic:

“The Good, the Bad and the Ugly: The Bible and Christian Faith”

Part history, part theology, and part autobiography, this series will discuss questions about the Bible in the context of faith. How exactly are we to understand the role of the Bible in Christian history? What does it mean to affirm the inspiration and authority of Scripture? How should the Bible be interpreted? What are we to do about difficult parts of the Bible, such as those which depict infant sacrifice or genocide in God's name? All of these questions and more will be addressed in this series.

Come join in what promises to be a most stimulating conversation!






Meet Our Members

The member we will be featuring this month is **Susan Beyer**, who joined our congregation about 2 years ago, with her fiancé Kevin Budziszewski. Susan was born in Welland, Ontario, and then relocated with her family to Kenmore, where she resided until graduation from high school. During her senior year she was in a student exchange program located in Trija, Bolivia. There she went to school to learn how to be a bilingual secretary. When she arrived back in the states she got married and had 3 girls. In between raising her girls, and taking care of the house, she returned to school at Buffalo State, and received her Masters in Bilingual Education (Spanish). Her first position was in Wilson, and has taught for almost 32 years at different schools. Currently she is located at South Park High School in Buffalo.

Susan went through a divorce after 12 years of marriage. She married again and had 2 boys by her second husband. After 20 years of marriage her second husband passed away. Her eldest daughter is Giselle age 34, a paralegal, Leslie age 32 is an orthopedic surgeon, and Dayna, a stay at home Mom is a mother of two. Her son Andy who is 25 now, unfortunately was hit by a car when he was 7 and suffered brain injuries. He works at Chef's as a dishwasher. The youngest is 24 year old Jacob, who is in Maritime College studying commercial shipping.

Obviously, she doesn't have a lot of spare time, but when she does, she enjoys swimming and watching sports with Kevin. Religion has always played a role in her life but she found it particularly helpful during her traumatic time when her son Andy was in rehabilitation after his accident. She also went through some trying times within the last 4 years when her house burned down and her Mom passed away 2 years ago.

We are glad Susan decided to choose our church, after her previous church, Parkside, closed. She appreciated the friendliness of our members when selecting a new congregation. And just this past year she has taken on the role of a deaconess for UPC.
